



Tyler E. Porter became the Area Port Director of Portland, OR in March 2020. Mr. Porter oversees nearly 100 employees, manages an annual budget of \$1.2 million for operations at seven ports of entry in Oregon, Washington and Idaho.

Mr. Porter was previously assigned to the Analytical Management Systems Control Office in Washington, D.C., where he had responsibility and oversight for the furtherance of CBP's integrity mission and for ensuring law enforcement methods and techniques were successful.

Prior to arriving in Washington, D.C. in 2018, Mr. Porter served as a Chief Supervisory Customs and Border

Protection Officer in Honolulu, HI, a position he held for three years beginning in 2015. He was responsible for passenger operations. During his tenure, he effectively worked with the Hawai'i Department of Transportation and other stakeholders to implement positive operational changes.

Mr. Porter served as a Program Manager of Field Programs from June 2014 until October 2015. Before arriving in Washington, D.C., he was a Supervisory Customs and Border Protection Officer in Tampa, FL, where he was directly responsible for both airport and seaport operations. Throughout his career he served in a variety of assignments and trainings throughout the land border, airport and seaport environment.
